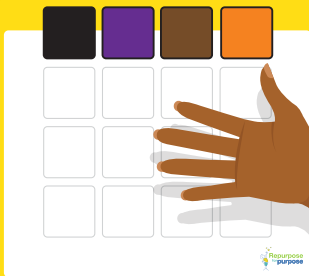

This is black, this is purple, this is brown and this is orange.

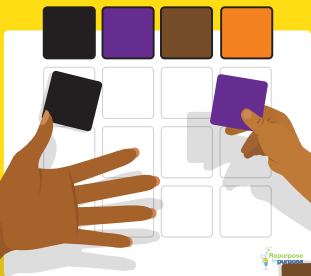


Activity 1B - Pg 17-18

STEP ONE

The child must select the Answer Card that they believe is the same as the Question Card in the top Margin.

STEP TWO

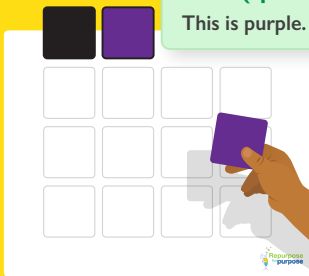
Put the Question cards into the top margin, saying the colour names, the child must repeat them after you.

STEP TWO

Help child mix up all of the Answer cards, place them upside down. The child must pick up the cards one by one, naming the colours as they go and match them to the question cards.

This is black.



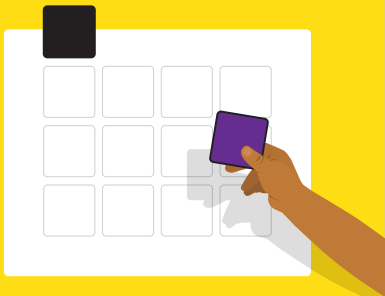

The child must put the 4 Question Cards in the top margin - in any order, naming them.

This is black, this is purple.

Help child mix up all of the Answer cards, place them upside down. The child must pick up the cards one by one, naming the colours as they go and match them to the question cards.



STEP FOUR

Help child to put the Question cards into the side margin, mix up the answer cards and when the child picks up the cards one by one they must name the colour before matching it.

Child (speaks)

This is black.

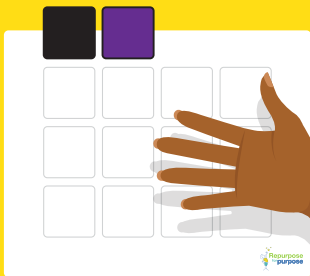

Place 2 Question Cards in the top margin in Column 1 and 2.



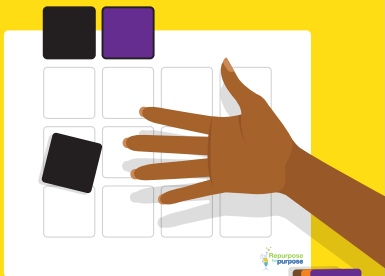
Activity 1B - Pg 19

The child must be given 4 Answer Cards (one of each colour) they must then repeat the pattern seen in the top margin; in Row 2.

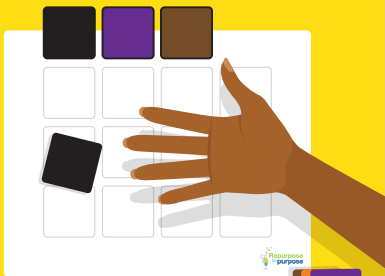


Activity 1B - Pg 19

Repeat with 3-4 cards if child is successful.

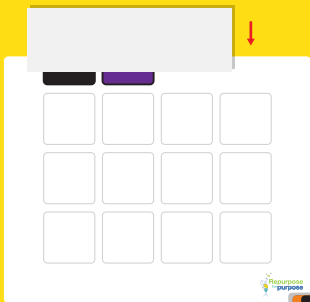


Activity 1B - Pg 19

STEP TWO

Make a pattern with 2 Question Cards, show the child then cover it with a piece of paper. Using their 4 answer Cards (one of each colour) they must match it.

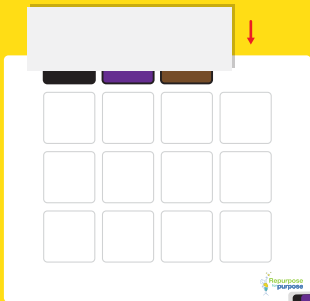


Activity 1B - Pg 19

If the child is successful. Then the game can be played with 3-4 Question Cards in a pattern of any order.

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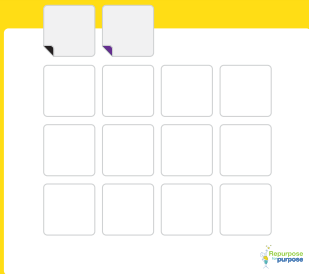

STEP TWO

Select 2 Question Cards and put them upside down in the top margin - say the colour order as your place them down but do not allow child to see the colour side.

Early Learning Facilitator (speaks)

Put down the black and then purple.



Activity 1B - Pg 20

STEP TWO

The child must be given 4 Answer Cards (one of each colour) they must then match the pattern in Row 3 - the original pattern can then be revealed



Activity 1B - Pg 20

STEP THREE

Repeat with 3-4 cards if child is successful.
